#### Digital Skills Workshop—Closing Ceremony

Closing ceremony of Digital Skills Workshop for Girls was held in Karachi and Islamabad in August and September to celebrate completion of 18-hours long training for 50 girls from Karachi & another 50 girls from Islamabad. The training enabled these girls to code a website. The participants learned HTML, CSS, and basics of JavaScript.

Guests from the US Embassy Islamabad and US Consulate Karachi were present at the occasion in the respective cities. In Islamabad Marcia Outlaw, Assistant Cultural Affairs Officer from US Embassy Islamabad graced her presence in the event. She spoke about the importance of this workshop as,



This workshop has shown a direction to you, your schools, teachers and administration spread knowledge to other students and other schools in your community.

In Karachi, Assistant Cultural Affairs Officer, the US Consulate General Karachi - Cameron Thomas Shah talked to students. Experts from the field of coding helped students understand career opportunities in the field of STEM focusing on coding and technology.

The websites made by students were focused on different topics from education to fashion, to a website that would promote skilled people of Pakistan and much more. The ceremonies came to end with certificate distribution to the participants and a networking session.

The objective of AeN outreach drive was to identify the schools, institutions, coaching/ language/ computer centers, community organizations and/or individuals that have the capacity and willingness to share information and access to the youth in the area and assist in recruiting young participants for this particular project. The outreach activity was carried out in Shirin Jinnah Colony where the following five sets of activities were executed during the outreach drive/campaign. About 12 outreach visits were planned initially but few places were visited later on again.



#### Mission to Mars—Space Challenge (Space Camp)



Two days Space Camp for the winning teams of Mission to Challenge successfully held on 30th July and 1st August, 2019. The winning schools namely KMA, Korangi Academy and Habib Girls came together in Lincoln Corner for the Space Camp where they learnt more about

STEM focusing space sciences. The participants not only designed different tools which can be useful in space using 3D printing software, they also got to print those designs using 3D printers. The activity enhanced critical thinking of the participants and their imagination power.

#### Mission to Mars—Space Challenge (Exhibition)

Mission to Mars Space Challenge Exhibition took place in Lincoln Corner on Saturday, 27th July, 2019. After the orientation session, the schools worked towards exhibition day on their respective projects around the four topics which were explained to them on orientation day. These themes were Technological Advancement, Survival on Mars, Colonization of Mars, and Marstronomy.

Society for International Education in collaboration with US Consulate Karachi, PSSEC and Lincoln Corner successfully pulled off the Mission

to Mars Space Challenge Exhibition where schools displayed their projects for judges, other participating schools and а larger audience.



Stephen Valen - Cultural Affairs Officer at Consulate Karachi presided

over the occasion and addressed the students. He congratulated the schools for putting up such an amazing display of hard work and research. He emphasized on the idea of team work and its importance. He also mentioned to students how it is important to have fun while learning.

The judges went around talking to the teams, listening to them and asking questions from them. Later each school got an opportunity to share their learnings on stage to a larger audience.

KMA secured the first position, Korangi Academy got the second position while Habib Girls stood third.

#### **Citizen Journalism Program Training**



The Citizen Journalism program successfully completed training for 200 participants, with the last round of classes on September 22nd, 2019. The trainings have been running since May, with students divided into groups to ensure that everyone gets ample attention in class. All students received 18 hours of training in four modules, namely, Fake News, Video Journalism, Photojournalism and News Writing & Reporting.

SIE invited Pakistan's top media professionals delivering lectures from the most reputed news organizations, including the BBC, Express, Newsline magazine and The News International and a producer with her work on Amazon Prime.

Some excellent stories have been reported by the students from reports on women rap artists in Lyari to the religious diversity of dhobi ghaats and profiles of individuals voluntarily serving their own communities as teachers, musicians, and sports coaches.

The first 'Dialogue and Discussion' session from the program was held in Mauripur's Tikri Village, and this was the first time that any NGO conducted a project there. The event was hugely successful both in terms of the stories the students presented and community participation, with over a hundred people from the village in the audience.

# **Enhance Your Images with Adobe Photoshop**

Karachi, 24th August, 2019: Society for International Education organized a one day workshop for teachers on "Enhance your Image with Adobe Photoshop." The training was held in Globe – the SIE Training Centre which was attended by 10 participants.

The training aimed at teaching the participants different editing tools in Photoshop which they can use for different purposes like their assignments and teachers can present classroom lessons more creatively.

They can also use these techniques to express themselves more creatively. They practiced the techniques during the workshop which gave them more confidence to use the software.

The participants learnt colour adjustment tools, blending cropping, spot healing, and other editing tools present in Adobe Photoshop. They were also taught basic design elements and principles. Combining these tools, the participants can design flyers, brochure, pamphlets and other promotional material. One of the participants said:

The hands on practice during the workshop really helped us learn different tools easily.

Everyone has ideas, not many people have the skills to express them creatively. This workshop was focused to help the participants to express their ideas more creatively using Photoshop.







#### **Setting Exam Papers**

SIE Professional Development workshop on "Setting Exam Papers" was successfully held on July 20th, 2019. Testing students' knowledge is the major aspect of teachers' job. Usually teachers follow a pattern of exam paper and ask questions from book/notebook to assess students' knowledge although they do not describe student learning.

The workshop focused on the 'Purpose of Testing' that is to provide a record for assigning grades and a learning experience for students to motivate them to learn and also provide them a guidance for future. Whereas writing lengthy answers in exam deviates from the objective of assessing their knowledge of given subject.

The workshop taught the participating teachers how to set exam papers in a way that makes exam and test papers more authentic and more reflective of teaching and learning in classroom.

#### **Eid Celebration Projects**

YES alumni Pakistan carried out a total of 14 Eid Celebration Projects at 8 locations nationwide, through which they involved the underserved communities in the Eid celebrations. The projects were carried out at Karachi, Lahore, Mansehra, Multan, Faisalabad,



Peshawar, Rawalpindi, Swat and Burewala. Through these projects, nearly 650 children were benefited along with the active engagement of 25 YES alumni.

The alumni focused on visiting the underserved children on the occasion of Eid and distributed different Eid gifts among them and played board games, sang songs and spent quality time with them. The alumni distributed candies, sweets and juice packets among them, shared henna, distributed bangles among the girls and played outdoor sports with the boys.



Meanwhile YES alumni from Burewala distributed uniforms among the children in accordance with Eid-al-Adha at a local underserved middle school. Overall, it was a fun day for the children as they celebrated Eid which

usually would have been a dull occasion for them.

#### **Summer Camp**

YES alumni from Gilgit carried informative and an successful summer camp. Through camp participants informed various scholarship opportunities nationwide and ways to secure admission in reputable universities.






Pakistani educational system lack career counselling on almost every level, in such a situation Summer Camps like these really help students with their career choices. Participants had a lot of question about

#### **Art and Craft Workshop**

One day long 'Art and Craft Workshop' was carried out by YES alumni from Karachi at Binae Welfare Institute. The alumni spent time with nearly 30 visually impaired adults. The workshop was divided into two sessions, painting and a game session. The aim of the workshop was to spread smile among the community of visually impaired adults and make them realize how important they are for our society. The project benefited and encouraged visually impaired people of our society to show their creative skills and share their ideas through art. The participants drew different objects such as flowers, flags and houses which showed their strong imagination skills. Most of the participants drew for the first time in their lives.



#### **Sports Gala**

Alumni from Gilgit, Hyderabad and Karachi carried out Sports Gala of different nature for their respective communities. In Gilgit nearly 60 girls were engaged in various competitive sports such as cricket, volleyball and football while in Abbottabad and Karachi the alumni

went to a local orphanage in their respective communities and played several indoor and outdoor games with the residents of the orphanage. The activities were appreciated by both the participants and community members because such activities are vital for development of the participants.

#### **Self Defense Awareness Seminar for Girls**

YES alumni from Gilgit carried out a Self-Defense Awareness Seminar for Girls, in which nearly 40 girls were educated about how to defend themselves from various street crimes in case they



suffer from any such situation. They practiced those moves in an interactive manner and learned different patterns.

The girls also worked with each other in different teams to learn about the importance of team work. The trainers showed videos to the girls about how to react to different circumstances and situations. The girls enjoyed practicing various moves. According to the participating girls they felt empowered while learning these tricks.



#### **Climate Change Awareness Workshop**

YES alumni from Karachi and Hyderabad carried out a one day workshop in their respective cities which was focused on 'Climate Change and Sustainability.' The workshops were divided into two parts, first part focused on theoretical understanding of climate change and causes of pollution and second part focused on recycling where students practically learnt how they can play a role to mitigate climate change. In the first session participants discussed issues related to climate change such as sixth mass extinction, effects of climate change on wildlife, composting, and 3R's. In the second part of the workshop students were provided with different waste material



which they had to recycle into a useful object such as bag, baskets, planting pots and cups. Around 54 students from each city participated. Through this workshop the students not only learnt about climate change,

they also learnt how they can play their role to fight it.

#### **Independence Day Plantation Drive**

This independence month YES alumni from Pakistan conducted a plantation drive in their respective communities where alumni from Rawalpindi, Lahore, Karachi, Shikarpur, Kohat, and Turbat planted trees and saplings in their schools, village, colleges, public parks and communities. Through this drive they conveyed the message that it is better to make Pakistan greener with more plants rather than flags. This way a healthy environment for everyone will



come into existence. With the climate change issues getting severe by the day, such activities are hope for a greener tomorrow which is a sustainable solution to pollution problems.

#### **Hygiene Awareness Project**

YES Pakistan alumni from Karachi and Chitral carried out a one day hygiene awareness project with different themes. Alumni from Karachi focused on 'Health and Personal Hygiene' while alumni from Chitral focused on 'Dental Hygiene'. In both



the cities the project was carried out at local schools where around 50 students from each city participated. In Karachi they were educated about precautionary measures they can take to stay healthy while maintaining a good hygiene while in Chitral the participants were educated about ways of staying away from cavities and maintaining a good dental hygine. Unfortunately many people are not vigilant when it comes to hygiene which makes such projects more beneficial.
