The seminar was attended by more than 200 participants of iEARN partner schools and other private and public organizations. Seminar presentations were done by local and international speakers who shared their thoughts and ideas with audience. The seminar sessions focused on the topics such as "Understanding the Digital Natives" and "Need for Restructuring Learning Experiences



for 21st Century Learners". Sessions also included YouthCaN and iEARN media projects and use of social media in education. The Chief Guest of the seminar was the Senior Minister for Education, Pir Mazhar-ul-Haq. In his speech, he emphasized on the need of integrating technology in education, making ICT available for all teachers and students in urban and rural areas.
